# Riders Complete the Tour de V Centre

Riding across Victoria to connect with mainstream and veteran organisations, our nine Tour de V Centre riders and our support crew achieved their goals and arrived safely at their destination.

The V Centre Veteran Empowerment Program has been open for 22 months and in that time, over 40 veterans have participated in this unique initiative, combining a safe place to live with an individually-tailored support program.

The objective of the Tour de V Centre was to ensure that those outside of metropolitan Melbourne were equally aware of this new service.

The Tour was only possible, thanks to the financial and in-kind support of sponsors (see page 7 for details).

The Tour de V Centre set out from Warrnambool, visiting Ararat, Ballarat and Geelong on its way to Box Hill.

The riders were incredibly lucky with the weather, especially given the spring we've had, with perfect weather right up until an hour



out of Box Hill and a head wind on the last day making it particularly tough.

## From Our CEO

#### A Vision for the Future at Frankston South

As you may have read in the Spring issue, plans for our Integrated Living Development at Frankston South are moving ahead.

We lodged the application with the Department of Transport and Planning in October and have been liaising with the Department to respond to their request for more information about various aspects of the project.

A development of this scale goes through a rigorous process of assessment during which it is advertised in the local community, and this will take some months.

We are at a very exciting time in the organisation's life: it feels appropriate that in celebrating our 20<sup>th</sup> birthday last year, Vasey RSL Care has reached 'adulthood' and we have very clear goals to fulfil our Mission and deliver on our commitments to our community. Our Frankston South development will respond to many of the needs expressed by veterans and their families and the wider community.

We recently held meetings with our Frankston South aged care staff, with residents and their representatives, and with residents in our ex-service accommodation. For the people living at Vasey RSL Care Frankston South, there will inevitably be some disruption and we will do everything possible to manage the project in such a way that this is minimised.

We will be holding a public Information Session on Monday 15 December, inviting adjoining neighbours to attend, and we welcome anyone who would like to find out more to come along.

# Frankston South Development Plans Update

'Inclusive Living' and 'Growing Our Impact' are two of the four priorities set out for the organisation in the 2025-30 Strategic Plan. The planned development of our Frankston South site responds directly to both of these, and indirectly to the remaining priorities, 'Veteran Transitions' and 'Support at Home'.

The Integrated Living Development will provide retirement living, residential aged care, affordable rental housing and assisted living options, combined with a piazza area with shops and services, a community hub, open space, rooftop gardens and ample parking space (some underground).

Vasey RSL Care Board Chair, Mike O'Meara OAM stated, "This is the most ambitious and complex initiative the organisation has undertaken and speaking on behalf of the Board of Directors, we are proud and excited to be bringing a project of this nature to Victorian veterans, their families, and the general public."

The project will be staged over a number of years to minimise the impact on current aged care and exservice accommodation residents: as one stage is

completed, residents will move in, enabling the next stage to begin.

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

With the Aged Care Act and Strengthened Standards coming into force on 1 November, a number of important changes have been enacted as the Government works to respond to the many recommendations of the Royal Commission into Aged Care Quality and Safety.

There are some important changes resulting from the new Aged Care Act including:

#### My Health Record

This is a summary of our personal health information, stored online. It is helpful for ensuring that practitioners have accurate and up-to-date information that informs the treatment they provide.

#### **Statement of Rights**

The new Act is a rights-based Act and the Statement of Rights outlines the rights older people have when accessing aged care services, both in residential and home settings.

#### Registered Supporter Role

This new role has been introduced with the new Act, allowing the older person to choose who can support them with decision-making *if* they wish to have someone in this role.

A Registered Supporter does not have decision-making authority: rather, they are there to support the older

person to make and communicate their own decisions.

## Be the Voice! Your Voice is Powerful

Calling for members for our Consumer Advisory Bodies and Quality Consumer Advisory Body.

Being part of your Consumer Advisory Bodies helps your voice to be heard. The information you provide goes directly to our governing body, the Board, and helps shape the way your care service is run.

Consumer Advisory Bodies can help solve problems and improve care. They give you a way to talk about

care and service quality with others and share this with our organisation's leadership.

Membership is open to residents and to residents' representatives.

## Reminder: Food Services Feedback

Our food services provider, Morrison Living, offers a simple way for residents and family members to provide feedback on residential aged care food services. Feedback is collated and reports are sent to Residential Managers each month.

The system is available in dining rooms, where Morrison Living staff can assist, or you can simply scan the QR code shown here to access the system.



If a complaint is received via the system, the Morrison Living team is alerted and will look into the situation and respond.

We encourage you to use the system to provide any feedback about our residential food services.

# **Successful Funding Submissions**

The Victorian State Government grant program has recently notified us of successful grant submissions:

- ⇒ The Victoria Remembers Fund 2025-26 has awarded Vasey RSL Care \$27,000 to develop a memorial to veterans at our Bundoora aged care home.
- → The ANZAC Day Proceeds Fund 2025-26 has provided \$130,000 to support the V Centre in further developing the program and to provide participants with a range of specialists with expertise across nutrition, physical and mental health.

The federal Department of Veterans' Affairs has notified us of a successful submission:

⇒ We have received \$7000 through the 'Veterans Health Week' grants to assist with events that focus on nutrition and wellbeing for veterans in our community, including our ex-service accommodation.

We would like to express our sincere gratitude to the state and federal governments for their support of our organisation and assisting us to achieve our Mission.

# 2025 AGM and Annual Report

The Board, Company Members, Auditors and Executive Leadership Team members met for the AGM at Box Hill RSL Sub-branch last month to present the finances for the 2024-25 financial year and carry out the business of the organisation.

Chair of the Board and meeting chair, Mike O'Meara OAM (pictured right), spoke of the changes in the

organisation that see us where we are now, with "clarity and confidence of vision".

He noted that while the new strategic plan sets out significant commitments for the next five years, the organisation is not chasing growth at any cost, but growth that achieves our Mission through the goals set, with sustainability an essential criterion, and all this while maintaining focus on our core business activities.

CEO Janna Voloshin (pictured above, far right) spoke of the growing confidence that funding bodies, including both state and federal government, have in Vasey RSL Care, as demonstrated by successful funding submissions, including \$4.6 million for the new 'V Satellite' project in Geelong. She noted some of the highlights of the year including an unprecedented 21 centenarians living in our aged care homes, growth from zero to 200+ clients in Veterans Home Care, the

approaching completion of 20 new affordable ex-service units at Bundoora and the organisation's strong financial position.



Chair of the Board Finance Committee, Tracey Bannan (pictured, second from left) reported that a number of factors have supported a good financial result, including strong occupancy rates in residential aged care, changes to the aged care funding model and fundraising/donations/ grants increases.

Three directors had reached the end of their three-year terms, Tony Carr, Dr Vanda Fortunato and Lucy Saaroni. Resolutions for their re-election were passed by the meeting.
